Day 1

Fly to King Shaka in Durban and travel to Ingeli Forest Lodge where we can enjoy the amazing view and amenities they offer. Anew Hotel Ingeli Forest and Spa is nestled below the Ingeli Mountain range near Kokstad in KwaZulu-Natal. Surrounded by breath-taking indigenous forests, this is the perfect place for you to chill and unwind at your own pace.

Day 2

Today we travel to Morgan Bay. Morgan Bay, officially renamed Gxarha in 2022, is a village in Amathole District Municipality in the Eastern Cape province. The holiday village of Morgan Bay was given its current name in 1822. It was named after A.F. Morgan, the master of the Barracouta, a survey ship of the Royal Navy. We spend two nights in Morgan Bay.

Day 3

After a delicious breakfast we enjoy a morning at leisure. The hotel offers a relaxing atmosphere. It is situated a short 45-minute drive from East London along the Wild Coast and nestled between a mile of unspoilt beach and breathtaking cliffs, you will be spoilt for choice on ways to spend your morning. Sit back and relax at the hotel and soak up the sun before lunch (own account). Our afternoon is spent on the Fish Eagle River Cruise on the Great Kei River. We will be going out on their two boats. A stunning array of birdlife awaits you from a unique perspective of being on the water. We enjoy dinner at the hotel.

Day 4

We travel via East London to Port Alfred. Our hotel for the evening is situated on the banks of Kowie River. Port Alfred was established in the early 1820s by British settlers who were moved into the area by Lord Charles Somerset as there was conflict between the Cape Colony and the Xhosa people. Originally, it was two separate towns (settlers arriving on the west bank in 1820 named their settlement Port Kowie, and those arriving on the east bank named theirs Port



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Frances). In 1860, when Queen Victoria's son Prince Alfred visited, the name was changed in his honor. In 1839, William Cock and George Hodgkinson started to block the natural river mouth to the east and canalize the present opening to the sea. By 1841 South Africa's first man-made harbour was opened after completion of the stone-lined channel between the ocean and the Kowie river.[4] This allowed high-masted sailing ships with their heavy cargo to dock at the wharf. **DBB – Port Alfred: My Pond Hotel**

Day 5

We travel via Bathurst to Makhanda (Grahamstown) where we meet our local guide who will take us on a town tour. The town Grahamstown went on to become a military, administrative, judicial, and educational center for the surrounding region. Bathurst is in the heart of one of the biggest pineapple growing areas in South Africa. Located on the outskirts of Bathurst we will find the world's biggest pineapple, standing 16.5 m high. The Bathurst "Pineapple" is constructed from a fiberglass outer skin covering a steel and concrete superstructure. We enjoy lunch at the historic Pig & Whistle Inn, the hotel is also comfortable walking distance to all Bathurst's National Monuments. Our hotel for the evening is situated on the banks of Kowie River. There is nothing more relaxing than ending the day with a sunset cruise on the Kowie River. **DBB – Port Alfred: My Pond Hotel**



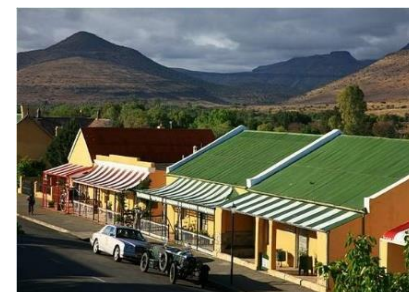
Day 6

We visit the Addo Elephant National Park, it is a diverse wildlife conservation park situated close to Gqeberha and is one of the country's 20 national parks. It currently ranks third in size after Kruger National Park and the Kgalagadi Trans-frontier Park. **DBB – Gqeberha: Blue Water Bay**



Day 7

On our way to Cradock, we travel via Cookhouse. Our stops in Cradock will include the Dutch Reformed Church and St. Peter's Church. We check into our accommodation for the evening and will then be met by Eagle Safari Tours who will take us into the Mountain Zebra National Park for an afternoon guided tour. **DBB – Cradock: Tuishuise.**



Day 8

After breakfast we travel via Elliot via Maclear to Kokstad. Kokstad is a town in the Harry Gwala District Municipality. Kokstad is named after the Griqua chief Adam Kok III who settled here in 1863. Kokstad is the capital town of the East Griqualand region, as it is also



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the biggest town in this region. It was built around Mount Currie, a local mountain range, by the city's founder Adam Kok III, for whom the town is named. Stad is the Dutch and Afrikaans word for "city". The town is built on the outer slopes of the Drakensberg and is 1,302 m above sea level. Behind it Mount Currie rises to a height of 2,224 m. It is a centre for cheese and other dairy products.

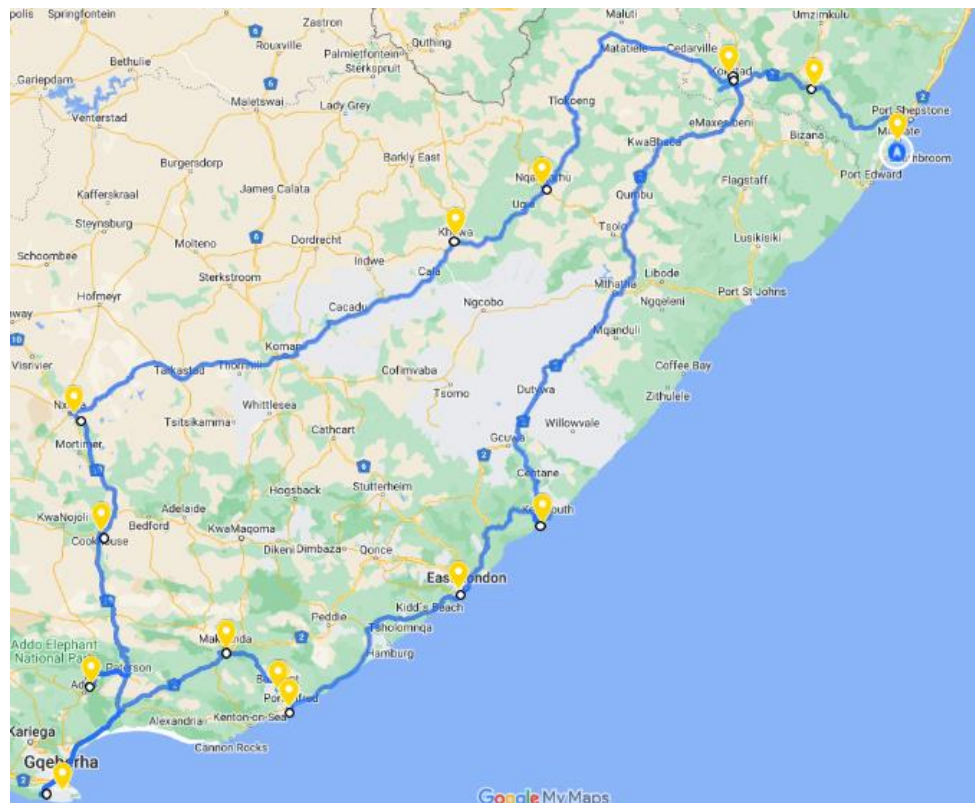
